Mission to Kikyusa (Uganda) January 18th-24th January

Thank you so, so much for all your prayers and support for this our first African led mission. This was indeed a new venture and a significant step forward for us.

Not quite Five Star!

On arrival the team of ten, led by Pastor Fred Mudde, found their accommodation to be a single room with earthen floor containing an ant hill which grew every day whilst they slept! The food provided to the team was also sadly poor.

A captive audience?

The team found that the place allocated for their crusade meetings was immediately next door to a mosque in the course of being built. An interesting challenge!

An amazing response

Despite these circumstances and very indifferent organisation on this occasion by the hosts (some real learning points came out here) there was a very strong response to the crusades and the films that we put on- with large crowds turning up each evening. This was greatly helped by the extremely good P.A. that we are now blessed with which broadcast the music and Gospel message over many miles.

The team saw a high number of salvations including many Muslims. One evening Pastor Fred Mudde was interrupted in full flow preaching by a Muslim lady who came forward crying after suddenly realising who Jesus was in her life.



In this area of much witchcraft there were many, many who received deliverance each evening.



The team saw many healings including a man who had not been able to walk properly for thirty years now able to jump because he was totally healed!!

In total the team saw **two hundred and thirty four** people give their lives to the Lord in the short time that they were there. We give God all the glory!

Unity of the Team

We were blessed by great unity within the team. This was constantly commented on by both the local pastors and others in a place where unity has been very rare.

Future Plans

A follow up visit will be made to Kikyusa in **April** and in the preparations for this will be emphasising to the local pastors the need for them to attend the training – so essential for the discipling of the new converts and the ongoing work of the Gospel.

As well as this, the team are also planning a follow up visit **later this month on 23rd-25th February** to Mutumba the location of the highly successful mission that was held last September. As it is a swampy area- and the season is getting increasingly wetter - your prayers would be greatly appreciated for a safe and successful journey there.

Finally, preparations are already in place for the next mission in **May**. This will be led by **Pastor Fred Makubuya** (a humble man who has planted 40 churches in 15 years and has been used to raise two people from the dead).
