### **Mission to Ngoma 21<sup>st</sup>-28<sup>th</sup> November- chief witchdoctor saved!**

We appreciate so much all your prayers and support for the last of our African led missions this year. This time to the small town of Ngoma in central Uganda. We praise God and give thanks for all that He did through the large team of twenty, most ably led by Pastor Morris Kigongo.

#### **God's protective 'umbrella'**

Your prayers for dry weather were spectacularly answered! Despite heavy rain **every** single day in the remainder of Uganda, (eg picture right of a street in Kampala) **hardly a drop** fell on Ngoma whilst the team were there.  
Hallelujah!



#### **God's presence**

The power of your prayers was again shown by the fact that people were coming forward to give their lives to Jesus **even before the preaching started**. **Such** was the presence of God on the place.



#### **Many saved, healed and set free**

The team were greatly blessed by seeing two hundred and twenty one people give their lives to Jesus. Plus many healed including the deaf and lame - the latter now **jumping for Jesus!** (right, team member Pastor Jane Naigaga –herself having been healed by God from epilepsy- praying for the sick.)

We praise God for the fact that there were a very, very large number of people afflicted by demonic spirits who were also set free.

## Ngoma's chief witchdoctor gives his life to Jesus!

We had some wonderful news straight after the mission. Pastor Fred Mudde (himself a former witchdoctor) went 'out on a limb' at the crusade on the last day to declare that if a particular witchdoctor (the chief one in the area) did not give his life to Jesus he would die! **Five days after the team had left Ngoma, this witchdoctor walked into a church to surrender his life to the Lord and brought along all his witchcraft stuff to be burned. Wow!**

## Future Plans

In a few days time (14<sup>th</sup>-17<sup>th</sup> December) we are returning to Rakai where we had a mission in September. Just one month later, in January, we have a mission planned for Kayonza, a village in central Uganda which will be led by Pastor Daniel Mulyani.

Dan has a most powerful testimony of God healing him of AIDS contracted before he became a Christian.
